Agenda 1: Welcome Remarks, Confirmation of the Minutes of 10 GBM and Action Taken Report

- The General Secretary (GS), Dr Anuradha Agrawal, welcomed the Chairman and all members of the General Body (GB) and expressed her gratitude for their presence in the meeting. She also offered condolences for ISPGR members/families of members who passed away due to the COVID pandemic.
- Dr R.S. Paroda, President, ISPGR, also greeted all members of the GBM and extended special welcome to Dr Ashok Kumar for taking charge as acting Director, ICAR-NBPGR.
- The minutes of the 10th GBM held on Jan. 30, 2020 were confirmed.
- The ATR report was presented by Dr Anuradha (*Annexure 2*).

Agenda 2: Progress report of ISPGR by General Secretary

- Dr Anuradha Agrawal, General Secretary (GS) presented the progress report of ISPGR (*Annexure 3*).

- Members appreciated the activities carried by the society, despite of the COVID-19 restrictions and constraints.

Agenda 3: Progress of IJPGR by Editor-in-Chief

- Dr Sunil Archak, Editor-in-Chief, presented the report related to publication of the journal (*Annexure 4*). He apprised the status of manuscripts, and as well as printing schedule and progress.
- As discussed in last GBM, Springer Publishers were contacted and all information required for internal process for review of Journal were provided to Springer. Due to financial terms and conditions the proposal was not found viable for ISPGR. Similar was the experience with Wolters Kluwer and Medknow. Accordingly, Dr J.L. Karihaloo suggested to drop the idea of tie up with international publishing house. Instead, he suggested that emphasis be given for open access publication to increase the readership.

(Action : Editor-in-Chief)

- Concern was expressed by members regarding absence of name of IJPGR in the UGC-CARE (Consortium for Academic Research and Ethics) list. Dr Subash Chandra, North Bengal University, urged that IJPGR needs to be included in UGC-CARE list because for faculty of non-agricultural university it is necessary to publish research papers only in those journals which are mentioned in the UGC CARE list.
- The President appreciated work done by EIC, Editors, Reviewers and ISPGR staff in journal updating and congratulated all members of editorial committee for increase in NAAS rating (from 5.12 to 5.54). He suggested that the matter regarding UGC-CARE may be taken up with appropriate agencies to have it resolved soon.

(Action : Editor-in-Chief)

Agenda 4: Financial Report of ISPGR by Treasurer

- Dr Dinesh Kumar, Treasurer, presented financial status of ISPGR (*Annexures 5-7*).
- The President placed on record the efforts made by the EC, especially Treasurer and GS in maintaining a healthy financial status, which has increased two fold since 2015. He suggested that concerted efforts be made to increase the membership (institutional and individual), to reach at least 1000 by the end of this EC's tenure. He also recorded his appreciation to Sh. Raju Barwale, Chairman, MAHYCO, for his continued financial support towards the annual Dr B.R. Barawle Award.

(Action : Treasurer and Councillors)

Agenda 5: Amendment in ISPGR Rules for holding elections (during 2021) via e-ballots (online)

- The GS informed that the ISPGR elections are now due. However, due to COVID-19 pandemic, there is general disruption in postal services. If ISPGR elections are conducted via the paper ballot mode (as done in past), there may be delays and disruptions (in case of any future lockdowns).
- Hence, it is proposed to hold the 2021 elections through use of e-ballots. Advances in digital technology has provided options for electronic voting, which has also been adopted

by other scientific societies. Use of e-ballots to conduct ISPGR elections shall also reduce the time and financial resources. The proposal was approved by EC in its last meeting.

- Accordingly, amendments in the Rule Book (Clause # 10) shall be made as follows:

v)	The Election Committee will take consent in writing from the contesting members by 20 October of the Election Year. The Election Committee will take consent in writing (over email/online) from the contesting members by 10 November of the Election Year. In case no consent is received from the concerned candidate by the due date, it will imply that he/she is not interested to contest.
vi)	The Election Committee will send ballot papers within 10 days of the deadline fixed for receipt of the consent to all the members with specific instructions on the norms of voting.	The Chairperson Election Committee will send online link within 10 days of the deadline fixed for receipt of the consent to all the members (by 20 November) with specific instructions on the norms of online voting.
vii)	The ballot paper should be received by the Election Committee within 45 days (15 December of the Election Year) of their dispatch.	The online votes should be submitted by the members by clicking appropriately on the online ballot form within 15 days (5 December of the Election Year) of the voting portal/link going live .
viii)	After the due date is over, the ballot papers will be opened and counting done by the Election Committee in the presence of the Contestants or the authorized representatives deputed by the contestants.	After the due date is over, the online votes will be counted by the Election Committee in the presence of the Contestants or the authorized representatives deputed by the contestants.

ix)	The Election Committee shall submit the result to the EC. The EC will announce the same on or before December 31 of the election year or preferably in the forthcoming annual GB meeting. The EC is empowered to nominate and fill up any uncontested/vacant posts after taking over the charge. On the date of assuming the charge as EC member, the membership should be valid.	<i>No change</i>
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- The GB approved the proposal to conduct ISPGR elections in electronic mode during this year (2021). It was also decided that the mode of next/subsequent elections could again be decided by the new EC (2022-24) in consultation with GB.

Agenda 6: Announcement of Elections and Election Committee

- The GS informed that EC had approved the name of Dr (Ms) V. Celia Chalam, Head, Division of Plant Quarantine, ICAR-NBPGR, New Delhi as Chairperson of Election Committee, during its eleventh meeting held on Aug 7, 2021. Dr Celia Chalam had agreed to the proposal and nominated two members of Election Committee, namely, Dr Kavita Gupta, Principal Scientist, Division of Plant Quarantine, ICAR-NBPGR, New Delhi and Dr Bharat Gawde, Scientist (SS), Division of Plant Quarantine, ICAR-NBPGR, New Delhi.
- The GB members unanimously agreed to the proposed names of the Election Committee.
- The GB agreed that elections be announced and conducted as per above schedule. Arrangements may be made for logistic support for conducting online mode of elections.
(Action : General Secretary and Joint Secretary)

Agenda 7: Launch of ISPGR Website

- The new website of ISPGR (<http://ispgr.nbpgr.ernet.in/>) was launched and demonstrated for the benefit of all members. The new website has dynamic features, including option for online membership form, list of members, display of news and archive of all activities and photos of events.
- The President, while appreciating the effort made, suggested that ISPGR members may visit the website and give suggestions for improvement of content, as well as aesthetics of the new website. He also urged that members may inform the ISPGR secretariat of any changes in postal address and emails of members, after checking their data on the new website.

Agenda 8: Remarks by Vice President

- Dr Kuldeep Singh, Vice President, ISPGR appreciated the activities of ISPGR congratulated all the members for their efforts. He applauded the dynamic leadership provided by Dr R.S. Paroda, President, ISPGR towards the progress of the Society.
- He expressed his concern that teaching in subjects like PGR and genetics at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels had declined in the Agricultural Universities, due to introduction of several new courses. He suggested that Education Division of ICAR be approached to institute a Committee to the review teaching of PGR at country level and make suitable amendments in curricula to rectify this situation. He further suggested that teaching

modules (text or videos) be developed for all SAUs/Botany Departments as well as for high school students related to PGR.

Agenda 9: Remarks by Chairman

- Dr R.S. Paroda, President, ISPGR recounted the genesis of the 1st IAC and efforts made by him, Ms Ann Tutwiler, Former DG, Bioversity International and current Director General, Alliance of Bioversity International and CIAT, Dr Juan Lucas Restrepo, to make the second IAC a reality. He expressed happiness that the IAC would now be a rolling event with the next one planned in China.
- He informed that 'UN Food Systems Summit', scheduled during the UN General Assembly in New York on Sept. 23, 2021 is setting the stage for global food systems transformation to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals by 2030. Accordingly, he urged that ISPGR may consider holding a National Dialogue on Local Food System for Health and Nutritional Security, within the next two months. This event may be planned in collaboration with ICAR-NBPGR, and Alliance of Bioversity International and CIAT.
(Action : General Secretary and Editor-in-Chief)
- He urged that actions be initiated to hold the elections of ISPGR in timely manner, besides continued efforts for increasing membership and enhancing journal quality.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair and all GB members by Dr Rakesh Singh, Joint Secretary.

Report by General Secretary, ISPGR

1. Meetings Held

- The 10th General Body Meeting (GBM) of the Indian Society of Plant Genetic Resources (ISPGR) was held on Jan. 30, 2020 at ICAR-NBPGR, New Delhi, under the Chairmanship of Dr R.S. Paroda, President, ISPGR (2019-2021).
- Since the last GBM, seven meetings of the EC (2019-2021) were held on July 28, 2020; Oct. 23, 2020; Dec. 29, 2020; Feb 6, 2021; April 7, 2021; July 24, 2021 and August 24, 2021 to discuss and decide the various issues related to activities and growth of the Society. In all, 11 meetings of EC and 3 GBM held by the current EC (2019-2021).
- Based on the decisions and suggestions of GB and EC meetings, the activities held and proposed are enumerated hereunder.

2. Webinar/Symposium Organized

(i) National Seminar on 'Crop Breeding for Wider Adaptation'

A two-day dual (virtual and offline mode) National Seminar on 'Crop Breeding for Wider Adaptation' was organized by Ranchi Chapter of Indian Society of Genetics and Plant Breeding (ISGPB) in collaboration with ISGPB, New Delhi and Indian Society of Plant Genetic Resources (ISPGR), New Delhi at Birsa Agricultural University (BAU) from Dec. 12-13, 2020. Drs R.S. Paroda, Kuldeep Singh and Anuradha Agrawal from ISPGR were members of National Advisory Committee, while Dr S.B. Chaudhury, Member, ISPGR was in the Organizing Committee.

Dr Kuldeep presented a Lead lecture entitled "Plant Genetic Resources in India: Management and Utilization" and Dr Anuradha Agrawal gave an invited talk on "Role of biotechnology in PGR conservation". Over 200 scientists, teachers and researchers from across the country participated in the two-day event. The experts discussed about plant breeding issues in different technical sessions themed on new frontiers in crop improvement, climate resilient breeding with quality enhancement, plant genetic resource management and pre-breeding, molecular breeding for crop improvement, traditional knowledge, breeders, farmers' rights and intellectual property rights issues. The proceedings of the meeting are uploaded on the website.

(ii) National Webinar on 'Implementation of Access to Plant Genetic Resources and Benefit Sharing (ABS)'

A virtual National Webinar on "Implementation of Access to Plant Genetic Resources and Benefit Sharing (ABS)" was held on August 27, 2020. The meeting was co-organized by the UN Environment Implemented GEF Project, Alliance of Bioversity International and the International Centre for Tropical Agriculture (CIAT), Delhi Office, and the ISPGR with technical support from ICAR- NBPGR, New Delhi, India; National Biodiversity Authority, Chennai, India; Protection of Plant Variety and Farmers' Rights Authority, New Delhi, and Trust for Advancement of Agricultural Sciences (TAAS), New Delhi. The webinar was attended by 200 stakeholders from academia, policy, management, farmers and private sector. The objective of the webinar was to (i) understand the existing inconsistencies in the ABS system and suggest measures for improvements including policy reorientation; (ii) suggest options for regulating ABS beyond rewards and recognitions and to devise means for BS by the communities for sustainable management of bioresources; (iii) suggest effective models of ABS to benefit both public and private organizations and (iv) to suggest

mechanisms for optimal utilization of National Gene Fund meant for effective BS and capacity development.

Dr R.S. Paroda, President, ISPGR had conceived as well as Chaired the webinar. Dr T. Mohapatra, Secretary, Department of Agricultural Research and Education (DARE) & Director General, Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) shared his views as Chief Guest of the inaugural session. Dr Juan Lucas Restrepo, Director General, Alliance of Bioversity International and CIAT provided remarks as special invite and support from the Alliance in organizing the webinar. Financial support was provided by UN Environment Implemented GEF Project and the Federation of Seed Industry of India (FSII), New Delhi. The proceedings and recommendations of the webinar are available on the ISPGR website.

(iii) Virtual Brainstorming on 'Digital Sequence Information and Germplasm Sharing'

A 'Virtual Brainstorming on Digital Sequence Information (DSI) and Germplasm Sharing' was held on March 1, 2021, organized by ISPGR, New Delhi. The purpose was to provide a forum to deliberate by experts and various stakeholders on DSI. The meeting was Co-Chaired by the two Vice-Presidents of ISPGR, Dr Kuldeep Singh, Director, ICAR-NBPGR and Dr R.C. Agrawal, DDG (Education), ICAR and National Director, NAHEP. Dr R.S. Paroda, President, ISPGR, presided the session and provided his special remarks. Dr Sunil Archak, National Fellow, ICAR-NBPGR and Editor-in-Chief, IJPGR moderated the session. To demystify the complexity of issues relating to DSI for GRFA and suggesting potential ways for developing comprehensive mechanisms for governance and fair use of genetic resources, two international experts, Ms. Anke van den Hurk, International Seed Federation and Mr Pierre Du Plessis, African Union, provided the divergent views on the topic. Thereafter, PGR experts from India's public sector, scientists, private seed industry, farmer representative and legal experts deliberated on the subject. Some 200 participants logged onto the virtual platform and attended the webinar.

(iv) 2nd International Agrobiodiversity Congress (IAC 2021)

The GS apprised the GB on the preparations of the 2nd International Agrobiodiversity Congress (IAC 2021) scheduled from Nov. 15-18, 2021, as a Virtual Congress. The theme of the Congress is 'Transforming food systems and delivering on the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development through the use and conservation of agrobiodiversity'. The Alliance of Bioversity International and CIAT and Italian Government are organizing the 2nd IAC in partnership with national and international research institutes and the UN Rome-based food and agriculture agencies. The Congress will build upon the work initiated by the 1st International Agrobiodiversity Congress (IAC2016) in India during Nov. 6-9, 2016, under the dynamic leadership of Dr R.S. Paroda, which culminated with the adoption of the 'Delhi Declaration on Agrobiodiversity Management'. ISPGR had played a pivotal role in organizing the 1st IAC2016.

Dr R.S. Paroda, President, ISPGR, was invited by organizers of 2nd IAC to be Member of International Advisory Board. On the inaugural day of 2nd IAC, Dr R.S. Paroda shall be invited for giving an overview on the 1st Agrobiodiversity Congress, and Dr T. Mohapatra, DG ICAR shall be giving a talk on the follow up action on the Delhi Declaration on Agrobiodiversity Congress. Dr Kuldeep Singh, Vice-President, ISPGR, shall be the Co-Convenor for the session on ex situ conservation.

ISPGR EC nominated Dr Anuradha Agrawal as Member of International Steering Committee (ISC) and Communication Committee (CC) of IAC2021. As a member of the ISC, the GS attended three meetings (April 1, May 26, June 23, 2021) with the Congress Secretariat. One

meeting as member of CC was also attended on June 9, 2021. Details about program and inputs from ISPGR were shared with the GB members., besides the details about the governance, themes and structure of the 2nd IAC. The IAC2021 website (<https://www.eatgrowsave.org/>) was open and all are invited to register (no fee required).

Names of scientists have been provided from ISPGR/NBPGR/other institutes for three scientific sub-committees (consumption, production, and conservation) to help in selection of abstracts. Call for abstracts was closed on July 7, 2021 and 638 abstracts received. This document is in draft mode and circulated amongst partners for providing inputs. ISPGR has been invited to organize a virtual side event (3-hour duration, pre-recorded). GB members were also informed about 'Rome Declaration' which builds on the Delhi Declaration, to be adopted in the IAC 2021.

3. ISPGR Awards and Recognition

- The Borlough Institute of South Asia (under CIMMYT) as co-organizers of the IAC2016, had paid for certain services/works on behalf of ISPGR (e.g. food, exhibition hall, mementoes etc.). In an email received on Feb 3, 2021 BISA office informed that during its 2019 Audit, with respect to IAC2016, auditors observed "while reconciling the IAC Event 2016 account BISA has made an excess payment to ISPGR for INR 4,51,337 on account of VAT refund received which is already adjusted from expenses details shared earlier". Accordingly, ISPGR returned the excess (due to excess payment of VAT) amount after suitable deduction of CA fees.

- Updating of KYC details of the ISPGR saving account of Bank (after merging of Syndicate Bank with Canara Bank), for the purpose of Income Tax Refund was carried out.
